# Environmental Action Plan



Based upon community input, the following outlines our environmental plans for the next three years:

## WATER

- Constructing and installing a stormwater park to control rainwater runoff, which will be available for use by the neighborhood and will feature a walking path surrounded by native vegetation, pollinator gardens and an educational pavilion
- Installing green buffer and bioswales on and around the plant location to improve neighborhood aesthetics, air quality, wildlife habitat, reduce noise and reduce stormwater runoff
- Hosting informative environmental events on the benefits of rain barrel capture of stormwater and providing rain barrels to interested residents



## AIR

- Enhance the State of Michigan's air monitoring network by installing an ambient air quality monitoring station on our property
- Planting 1,100 new trees both on our property and within the immediate neighborhood in counsel with arborists and residents
- Transforming 300 vacant lots into green spaces by planting trees, shrubs and gardens together with community organizations
- Partnering with the Wildlife Habitat Council to create and support thriving urban biodiversity, pollinator habitats and on-campus conservation projects

## SOLAR

- Installing solar-powered bus stop shelters together with the Detroit Department of Transportation, providing residents a well-lit location and available mobile device charging stations



## EDUCATION

- Supporting the Chandler Park Conservancy on development of their Education Plaza.
- Hosting ongoing programs, such as "Salmon in the Classroom," with local schools to build awareness and educate young students on the benefits of environmental stewardship
- Establishing a quarterly newsletter to communicate FCA-related community activities and environmental initiatives

## NEXT STEPS

In early 2019, we announced plans to invest \$1.6 billion to build the first new assembly plant in the city of Detroit, now called Mack Assembly Plant. In addition, we are investing \$900 million in the Jefferson North Assembly Plant to retool and modernize the facility to build the Dodge Durango and next-generation Jeep® Grand Cherokee.

Together, the investments will bring nearly 5,000 new jobs to the east side neighborhoods.

## Permit To Install Applications

To complete these projects, we need to obtain authorization from the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE). As such we filed applications requesting minor revisions to the Permit to Install (PTI) issued to Mack Assembly Plant in 2019 and a new PTI for Jefferson North Assembly Plant.

## Public Comment

EGLE plans to allow the public to comment on its proposed actions related to these applications to ensure thorough review of the proposed plans.

Although the applications describe two separate projects, EGLE has decided to release the permits for public comment at the same time. Public comment period is now open and will remain open until Sept. 18.

# Hiring Detroiters

## Hiring Detroiters is Underway for New Mack Plant

As construction continues on FCA's new assembly plant, the first Detroiters began interviewing on July 13 to become part of the Mack family.

More than 3,600 qualified individuals from the first wave of Detroit applications have been invited to the plant over the next few months -- about 100 each day -- to participate in an interview and a hands-on assessment of common manufacturing processes.

FCA's second application window was just extended for all pre-qualified Detroiters through Aug. 31, one month longer than originally planned. Successful candidates will help fill 3,850 new jobs.

## FCA Provides Food and Face Masks to 2,400 Detroit Families

As part of the company's ongoing COVID-19 relief efforts, FCA employees have been active in the metro Detroit area sharing food, face masks and household supplies with members of the community.

On Detroit's east side near the site of FCA's new assembly plant, the company partnered with the City of Detroit and several community organizations to ensure that 2,400 families have access to healthy

food, face masks and other household necessities.

At two separate giveaway events held at the Samaritan Center, FCA employees worked alongside community volunteers and former elected officials, loading residents' vehicles with non-perishable food, face masks, hand sanitizer, shampoo, shower gel, toothpaste, and other household items.

# Never Eat The Science

## FCA Foundation Brings STEM Program to Detroit Enterprise Academy

Michael Niedballa, an educator at Cranbrook Institute of Science, quizzed a seventh grade science class at Detroit Enterprise Academy:

“What are the other senses?” “Taste,” answered several students in unison.

“One thing we never do in science... we never eat the science,” Niedballa cautioned, discussing how researchers use their senses as part of the scientific process.



Niedballa's lesson on chemical reactions, and other lessons in the weeks ahead, are part of a new STEM education and environmental outreach program made possible by a partnership of the FCA Foundation, the charitable arm of Fiat Chrysler Automobiles, and Cranbrook Institute of Science.



The program will deliver hands-on science, technology, engineering and mathematics education to 4,500 students across southeastern MI.

Beyond investments in education, the FCA Foundation also focuses on youth development, military veterans, disaster preparedness and volunteer service.

“By participating in these lessons now, students are able to gain problem solving skills, build collaboration skills and be creative which will help prepare them for the future,” said Gagnon. “Being part of the grant from the FCA Foundation, our students have the unique opportunity to work side by side with real scientists.”

Last year, the FCA Foundation awarded \$1.65 million in grants to Detroit-area non-profits with the goal of improving educational outcomes for students.

### New Marshland in Chandler Park

The Chandler Park Conservancy is excited to announce the grand opening of the new Marshland in Chandler Park featuring a walking path to promote physical activity and an observation bridge to take in the magnificent scenery.

The marshland holds over 2.5 million gallons of stormwater and provides

habitat for wildlife. After rain and snowfall, the remaining water will run into the marshland. This water will then be absorbed by plants and will evaporate back into the air.

Not only does the marshland tremendously benefit our ecosystem, but reduces the amount of stormwater entering the city's sewer system, street flooding, basement backups, and sewer overflow to the Detroit River!
