1917 Chalmers merged with the Maxwell Company, forming the Maxwell-Chalmers Company.


1925 The Maxwell-Chalmers Company became Chrysler Corporation.



Q: When will hiring start?

A: We anticipate hiring could begin in Q1 2020.

Q: Will my house be taken or purchased for this project?

A: No homes, churches, or businesses will be acquired for this project. In fact, the City of Detroit has committed to acquiring the land to accommodate the plant expansion "... without displacing a single resident."

Q: Will the project include Detroit riverfront property?

A: No. The project excludes the 10-acre parcel that encompasses the Edison Boat Club. This land will be retained by DTE.

Q: How will the FCA Plant Expansion benefit me?

A: The City of Detroit and FCA, through the Community Benefits process, will proactively engage the community to identify community benefits and address potential development impacts.
